#### **Program Notes**

Restless Birds before the Dark Moon was commissioned by the United States Military Academy Band and written for alto saxophone soloist, Staff Sergeant Wayne Tice for premiere at the World Saxophone Congress in Montreal, July 7, 2000. The work is demands virtuosity and skill from both ensemble and soloist as it explores the possible many timbrel combinations between the two.

As the title suggests, the mood ranges from foreboding to frenetic. Despite its extremely energetic opening there is also an underlying lyricism throughout much of the work. This lyricism comes to full fruition at the close of the middle section with the saxophone soaring above a darkly colored brass chorale. The composer employs both modal and chromatic materials with equal force and often presents the same idea transformed from one of these poles to the other. Although the opening passages are modal they are soon interrupted by sharp and sudden chromatic interjections which turn into sustained and sweeping descending harmonies in the middle section. The interjections return again in original form near the end of the piece just before a final burst of energy, which pits the soloist against the entire ensemble in rapid-fire unison.

### Biography

Since the premiere of Second Composition for Large Orchestra by the Seattle Symphony in 1968, David Kechley's work has been has been commissioned and performed throughout North America, Europe and other parts of the world. Over 800 performances have taken place including those by the Minnesota Orchestra, Cleveland Orchestra, Boston Pops, Seattle Symphony, North Carolina Symphony, Colorado Symphony, St. Paul Chamber Orchestra, Kronos Quartet, Lark Quartet, and the United States Military Academy Band.

His work is published by Pine Valley press and available on compact disc from Albany Records, Reference Recordings, and Liscio Recordings. His most recent disc, *In the Dragon's Garden: Music by David Kechley* released by Liscio features his award winning guitar and saxophone work by the same name as well as *Stepping Out* (for saxophone quartet), *Valencia* (for marimba and saxophone quartet) and *DRIVELINE: A Powerwalk for Guitar and Saxophone*.

Kechley's works have been featured at national and international conferences including the Music Educators National Conference(1968), American Harp Society(1974), American Society of University Composers(1981), College Music Society National Conference(1990), World Saxophone Congress (1985, 1988, 1992, 1997, 2000), Fifteenth Annual New Music and Art Festival at Bowling Green State University, North American Saxophone Alliance(1992,1996,1998,1999), and Guitar Foundation of America International Festival(1993).

Kechley has twice received grants from the National Endowment for the Arts and, in 1979, was awarded a Fellowship by the John Simon Guggenheim Memorial Foundation. His Five Ancient Lyrics on Poems by Sappho was first prize winner of the 1980-81 Shreveport Symphony Composers' Competition and Concerto for Violin and Strings won the 1979 Opus I Chamber Orchestra Contest for Ohio Composers. In the Dragon's Garden was a winner of the 1994 Lee Ettelson Prize and two of his orchestral works, Lightning Images and TRANSFORMATIONS: An Orchestral Triptych received honorable mentions in the 1994 and 1998 ASCAP Nissim Competitions. Kechley received the only Artist Fellowship awarded to a composer in 1985-86 by the North Carolina Arts Council and received an Artist Grant from the Massachusetts Cultural Council in 1995. He was awarded a Barlow Foundation commission in 1999 along with several commission grants from the American Composers Forum and continuous ASCAP awards since 1979.

David Kechley was born in Seattle where he received a Bachelors Degree in 1970 and Masters in 1974 from the University of Washington. He completed a Doctorate in Composition at the Cleveland Institute of Music in 1979. He is presently Professor of Music at Williams College in Williamstown, Massachusetts.
